Directors' Note

Having written a few plays for The Baron's Men (A Tale of Robyn Hoode, The Dead of Winter), we were idly brainstorming our next project when two thoughts emerged: Laura remarked on her (somewhat unhealthy) love of the French Musketeers, and Aaron was determined their next play would feature the hard-working women of the troupe (The Baron's Men has and has always had more women than men...ALWAYS!) since so many 'period' works have far fewer female roles.

Much discussion, planning, arm-wrestling and slap-fighting later, both authors are very proud of *All For One*, a story set in the "Musketeer-verse". Based on the historical event "The Day of the Dupes" where Marie de Medici lost a power struggle with Cardinal Richelieu and fell out of favor with King Louis (her son), through the magic of storytelling the playwrights explore the notion... what if Marie's scheming was more far-reaching than anyone knew? What if Marie had a network of spies and warriors, all loyal to her...and all women??!

All For One explores that novel and fictional concept, turning convention on its ear and rebuffing stereotypes in a tale featuring female heroes, female villains...and of course all the swordplay you'd expect in a tale set in the time of the Musketeers! There is a plot against the King, and who does the plotting? A woman. Who uncovers the plot? A woman. Who tries to alert the male authority, only to be rebuffed and insulted? The women. Who takes it upon themselves to foil the plot and save King and country? The women again! Pity those who underestimate the stronger sex...

So what are the Musketeers doing while all this is happening, you might wonder? A fair question, and the answer is...off doing Musketeer-y things of course! No doubt those loyal and laudable gents are gallivanting about to gather their glory, but not so the women in our tale. Our heroes summon courage and defy peril all for love of King and country, seeking neither glory nor reward... and doesn't that seem like a story worth telling?







